Dear Parents / Carers,

We have been contacted by West Sussex County Council Education Service to hold a meeting on **Tuesday 14th May** in School between **3.30 – 4.15pm in the school hall** 

This meeting will only be for parents and carers of pupils at our school and will allow the Education Team (Lucy Butler, Director of Childrens Services; Claire Hayes, Assistant Director of Education & Skills; and Graham Olway, Head of Organisation & Planning) to give you an update on the proposals affecting both St Anthony's & Jessie Younghusband and for you to ask questions and give your views on the proposals to the County Council officers.
